

**Message from Vice Provost Kevin G. Shollenberger Regarding a Meeting with Student Protesters, May 16, 2019**

Thank you for your reply.

President Daniels and Provost Kumar are available at 9 am, on Tuesday, May 21, and we have again reserved a space at FastForwardU (320 W 29th; Suite 200).

As a reminder this invitation is for 10-15 of the student protesters who left Garland Hall voluntarily and are interested in a discussion of the substantive issues of concern for the SAPP and the Anti-ICE coalitions. We're again happy to offer to live-stream the meeting, and, as per usual, we will post our communication about the meeting on the provost office website. If a larger number of student protesters need to attend, we need to know as soon as possible so we can make appropriate arrangements. We ask that you send the full list of attendees no later than Monday, May 20 at 10 am. We will also share if any additional administrators will join the meeting with the President and Provost.

With respect to amnesty, in brief, voluntary departure from the Garland occupation refers to student protesters who accepted any of the repeated requests and offers from the University or the Baltimore Police Department to leave the occupation and its environs without arrest. Such students are eligible for amnesty, subject to the limits articulated in the document provided last week ([The University's Extension of Amnesty to Garland Hall Protesters, May 7, 2019](#)) (e.g., not for bodily harm, substantial property damage, sexual misconduct, criminal charges other than trespass).
